Andaman Islands

The Andaman Islands form an archipelago in the Bay of Bengal between India, to the west, and Myanmar, to the north and east. Most are part of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Union Territory of India, while a small number in the north of the archipelago, including the Coco Islands, belong to Myanmar.

The Andaman Islands are home to the Sentinelese, who have had no contact with any other people. The Islands have been inhabited for several thousand years, at the very least. The earliest archaeological evidence yet documented goes back some 2,200 years; however, the indications from genetic, cultural and isolation studies suggest that the islands may have been inhabited as early as the Middle Paleolithic. The indigenous Andamanese people appear to have lived on the islands in substantial isolation from that time until the 18th century CE.

The Andamans are theorized to be a key stepping stone in a great coastal migration of humans from Africa via the Arabian Peninsula, along the coastal regions of the Indian mainland and towards Southeast Asia, Japan and Oceania.

Wild Grass Resort

The resort is about 45 minutes away from Port Blair Airport and is in a very green and picturesque location of Chidiya Tapu, walking distance from the beach where one can go diving, bird watching and forest trekking.

The area is known for its endemic bird species.

How to reach

To get to Wild Grass Resorts, one can take any of the following options:

- Drive from Veer Savarkar International Airport (IXZ), VIP Rd, Nayagaon, Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Island: 50 min
- Drive from port Blair: 45 min

There are no trains to Andaman Islands, the nearest connected railway station is in Chennai.

Best Time to Visit

Summers of Andaman and Nicobar are pleasant and mildly warm. This is a good time to visit Andaman and Nicobar Island. The best time of the year to visit the Andaman Islands is between **October and March**. It is also the time for the annual tourism festival. The waters are clear and relatively placid after the monsoons making them perfect for snorkelers and swimmers.

Day Activities at Wild Grass Resort

Diving and Fishing

The resort excels in conducting diving, snorkelling, night diving sessions.

Chidiya Tapu

Chidiya Tapu is just 10 minutes away from wild grass and this place is famous for sunset view.

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Sightseeing

Experiences around wild grass resort

Located near the city of port blair, there are plenty of activities and experiences that you can avail at the places.

Ross Island

Ross Island is an island of the Andaman Islands. It belongs to the South Andaman administrative district, Andaman and Nicobar Islands. the island is lying 3 km east from downtown Port Blair.

Cellular Jail

The Cellular Jail, also known as Kala Pani, was a colonial prison in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, The prison was used by the British especially to exile political prisoners to the remote archipelago

Viper island

Built during 1864-67, the walls of Viper Island jail echo the cries of Indian freedom fighters. The ruins of the jail, worsened by the 2006 Tsunami destruction, can barely depict the saga that unfolded there.

Samudrika Naval Marine Museum

Samudrika Naval Marine Museum is a museum situated in Port Blair. The museum is run by the Indian Navy. This museum aims to generate awareness about the environment in the ocean and the marine life

Forest musuem

Forest Museum is a famous attraction for its wide collection related to forest and the assortment of trees. This prominent museum is a must visit place in Port Blair and it is managed by the forest department of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The major attractions that are set on display in this museum include the artefacts that are made from timber, gurjan, oak, satin wood and paduak.

Gandhi Park

Located in Wandoor some 30 kilometers away from Port Blair, this park was established to protect the distinct marine animal life and ecosystem of the Andaman islands. Even though several islands are included within the boundaries of this park, based on time of the year, entry to either Red Skin Island or Jolly Buoy island is permitted. On this islands, one can take up snorkeling to see the marine life of corals, fishes, sea cucumber and other creatures. Riding on a glass bottom boat also gives an insight into the marine world.
